- 1 Trinidad and Tobago (Traditionally it is held on the Tuesday after Easter. It is called the Buccoo Goat Festival and thousands of people attend each year)

- 5 St. John's - the largest city on Antigua and Barbuda
- 6 The Bahamas. Nassau is the largest city in the Bahamas and is reported to be home to just over 70% of the Bahamian population
- 7 1973. Prince Charles delivered the official documents to Bahamian Prime Minister Lynden Pindling on 10 July, 1973. It was on the same day that The Bahamas joined the Commonwealth as an independent state.
- 8 Barbados. There are 64 species of flying fish with wing like fins. They are one of the national symbols of Barbados.
- 9 Grenada. The island is particularly famous for its nutmeg and mace. It also produces ginger, cinnamon, turmeric, cloves and allspice.
- 10 Guyana – it set in the Amazon rainforest on the Potaro river. The falls are 251 metres high, with a flow of 663 cubic metres of water every second.
- 12 Jamaica – He was born in Nine Mile in 1945. Marley was a global symbol of Jamaican music
- 11 St. Kitts and Nevis. They are said to have been introduced from Africa and the monkeys are famous for displaying human-like characteristics and emotions.
- 13 Bridgetown. It was Founded in 1628 and the city is now a major tourist destination. It covers 40 square kilometres and is the largest city in Barbados.
- 14 St. Lucia Sulphur Springs is the world's only drive-through volcano, and it is a major tourist attraction located near the town of Soufriere.
- 15 Guyana Located on the Atlantic Ocean coast, this is known as the “Garden City of the Caribbean.”
